

# Where does the garbage go ?

To recycle it.**

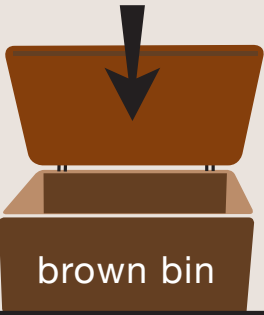
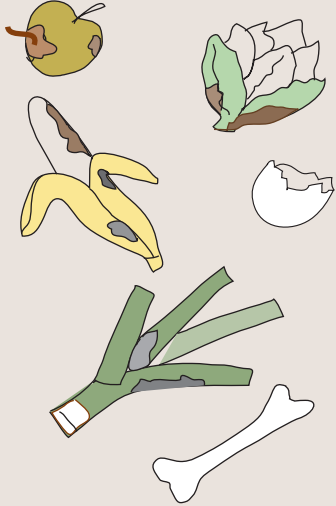
Here, garbage is everything that is left over, broken or that cannot be used anymore.

However, we don't just throw this garbage away but separate it into different bins and containers, which are then emptied and collected regularly by the garbage men.

This allows us to recycle useful materials and save a lot of money. Furthermore, it contributes to a clean environment.

The following page gives an overview of which garbage goes into which bin.

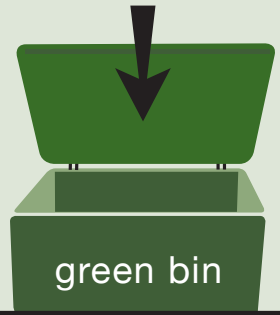
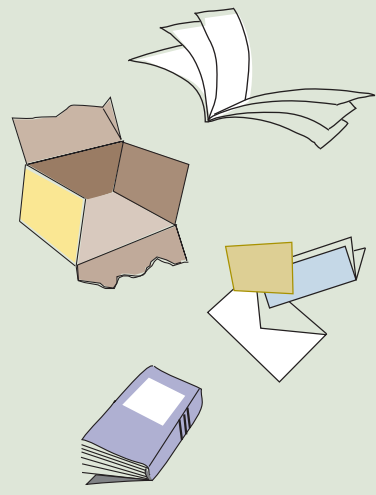




brown bin

**Bio (organic)**

For garden or kitchen waste.



green bin

**Papier (paper)**

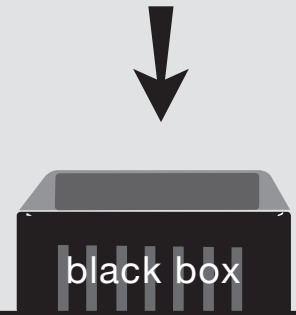
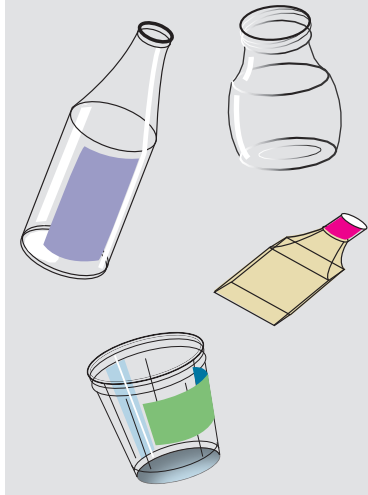
For left-over paper, empty cartons and packaging made of paper or carton.



yellow bag

**Verpackung (packaging)**

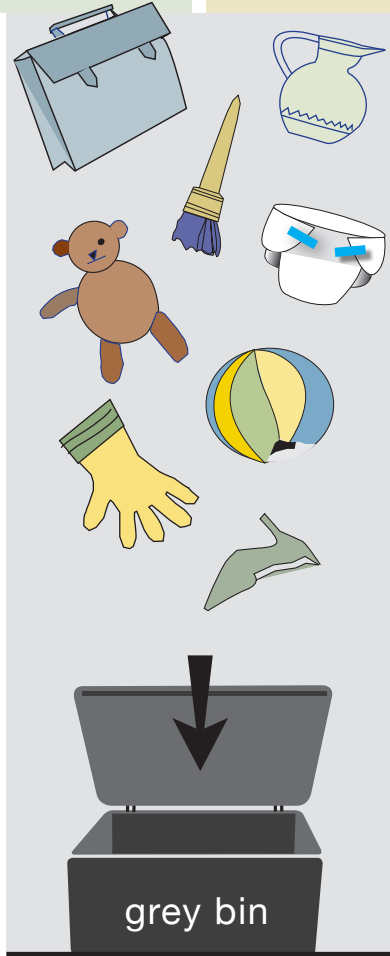
For empty packaging made of plastic, metal or composite material.



black box

**Glas (glass)**

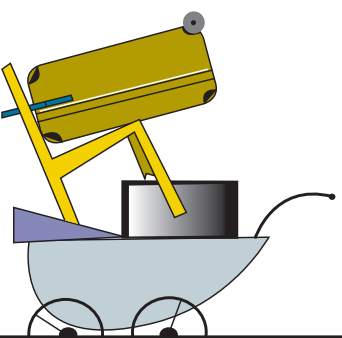
For empty containers/packaging made of glass (no returnable bottles).



grey bin

**Restmüll (residual waste)**

Any non-recyclable waste belongs into this bin.



**Too big**

Anything too big to fit into the bin for residual waste is considered **Sperrmüll** (bulky waste). Twice a year, it is collected free of charge.



**Too toxic**

The following is no residual waste: electronic devices, household chemicals, paint, batteries. **Problemüll** (hazardous garbage) is collected separately.
